## A message from our Principal - Simon Anderson

### Parent Teacher Interviews and Reports

Over the past few days you should have received your child/children's reports on Compass. Hopefully you took the opportunity to book an interview with the class teacher to discuss your child's progress. If you did not meet with them, please contact your class teacher to organise a time that is mutually agreeable, at some stage. It is imperative that you model to your children an interest in their learning.

### Attendance

Over the course of this year we have been constantly reminding parents about the importance of regular attendance at school. Unless your child is sick they should be in attendance and punctual to class by 9am. All children go into their classrooms at 8:50am to organise themselves for the start of the day, officially they are late **after** the 9am bell rings.

In your report you would have read the number of days absent your child has had. Six days or less would mean that your child should average about 12 days per year, which is the state average. We had lots of children who only had a day or two off for illness which is outstanding.

Unfortunately, we also have a number of students who are in excess of this total .... Let's hope we can attend more regularly in Term 3!

In light of this, we are implementing an acknowledgement program to recognise our children who have been attending on a highly regular basis. Children who have missed 3 or less days per term **and** been late on less than 3 occasions will receive a certificate to recognise their great attendance. Some children will of course miss out as they may have been unwell for a longer period but hopefully they may win a certificate next term!

### Bikes and Scooters

Over the past few days I have had to speak to numerous children in regards to riding to school without a helmet. Not only is it school policy that all children wear a helmet, it is the law. Please ensure that your child has an appropriate helmet to wear when riding to and from school. We want all of our students to be safe!

Also, please remind your children that when they are on school grounds, before and after school, that they are to **walk** their bike/scooter ....there are far too many people at our school - making an accident more likely!

Next week is our last week of term....I trust that you will all enjoy some quality family time over the two week break and look forward to seeing you all next Term.

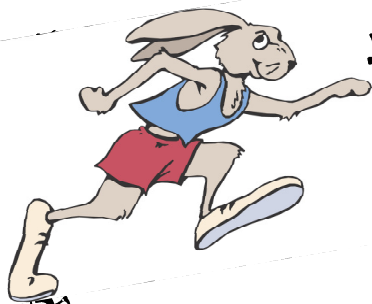

### **TUITION FEE RATES**

Group lessons (up to 4 in a group)=\$18 per week, (full term payable by week 2 of term)

**Once a term has commenced you are responsible for the whole term fees, if you cancel mid term you will be invoiced for the entire term.**

- All lessons are 30 minutes in duration and are held on a weekly **rotational** timetable, during school time and snack/lunchtime breaks.
- All students enrolled in the instrumental program at PPS are encouraged to join one of the ensemble groups organised by the school as their ability develops.

### **Give It A Go Music (with Kerri Rowe)**

**This course is available all year and is an introduction to the band instruments saxophone, clarinet, flute & trumpet.**

The course is designed to help you to discover which instrument you might like to learn as a major study instrument.

The course runs for **8 lessons only** and explores the use of the above mentioned instruments.

**FEES.** \$120 for the course and \$50 for the instrument hire **total \$170**

(Fees for this course must be paid before the course commences or instruments will not be allowed to be brought home.

#### CAMPS, SPORT & EXCURSION FUND

The CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to help cover the cost of school excursions, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for this CSEF payment.

The allowance will be paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities.

The annual CSEF amount per student is \$125 for Primary School students.

**How to apply:** Contact the school administration office to obtain a CSEF application form or print one from the school website.

**If you received CSEF in 2017, you are NOT required to complete a new application form, unless you have a PREP student starting this year.**





In primary school, some students **miss** on average **3 weeks** of school per year. That's **half a year** of school by the end of **year 6**.



# EVERY DAY COUNTS

Primary school attendance

Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education. Students learn new things at school every day – missing school puts them behind.

## Why it's important

We all want our students to get a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day.

If students miss school regularly, they miss out on learning the fundamental skills that will set them up for success in the later years of school.

There is no safe number of days for missing school – each day a student misses puts them behind, and can affect their educational outcomes.

Each missed day is associated with progressively lower achievement in numeracy, writing and reading.

## Getting in early

Attendance patterns are established early – a child regularly missing days in kindergarten or in the early years of school will often continue to miss classes in the later years, and receive lower test scores than their classmates. It's vital that students go to school every day – even in the early years of primary school.

## What we can do

The main reasons for absence are:

**Sickness** – There are always times when students need to miss school, such as when they're ill. It's vital that they're only away on the days they are genuinely sick, and setting good sleep patterns, eating well and exercising regularly can make a big difference.

It's vital that holidays are planned during school holidays where possible, and not during the term if it can be avoided.

**"Day off"** – Think twice before letting your child have a "day off" as they could fall behind their classmates – every day counts.

**Truancy** – This is when students choose not to go to school without their parent's permission. There can be many reasons for truancy. The best way to address this is for schools and parents to work together.

If for any reason your child must miss school, there are things you can do with your school to ensure they don't fall behind:

- Speak with your classroom teacher and find out what work your child needs to do to keep up.

- Develop an absence learning plan with your teacher and ensure your child completes the plan.

Remember, every day counts. If your child must miss school, speak with your classroom teacher as early as possible.

Openly communicating with your child's school about all absences is a good way to prevent attendance issues being escalated to a School Attendance Officer. A School Attendance Officer is a Department of Education and Early Childhood Development Regional Director who has authority to follow up attendance issues. Attendance issues that are escalated can lead to an Infringement Notice.

If you're having attendance issues with your child, please let your classroom teacher know so we can work together to get your child to school every day.
