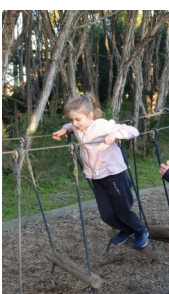
HUMAN POWERED VEHICLE TEAM

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Get Your Get Your Maths On! Week 1



Every Newsletter week there will be an open ended task or Mathematics game for parents/guardians to complete with their child. It is all about increasing engagement with Mathematics and improving fluency and problem solving skills. This week's task is;

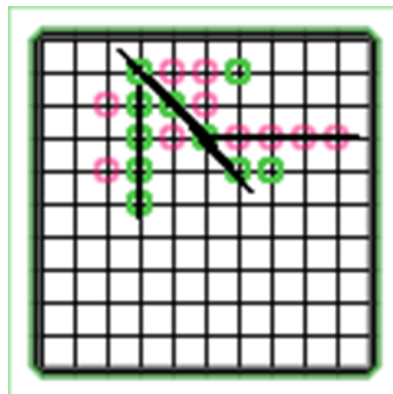
Line of Four

You will need a sheet of squared paper or 'grid' paper. If you don't have any, just rule some lines down some lined writing paper to form squares. One hundred squares (10 by 10) makes a good size game board, but you can use a smaller grid if you prefer.

Two players, using two different colours, take turns to mark a 'cross-road' on the grid (putting a dot at the intersection of two lines). The aim is to make a line of four, across, down or diagonally.

Each 'cross-road' can only be used once. Try to block the other player's path. Each time you make a line-of-four draw a line through it so it can be counted as a point. When all the 'cross-roads' have been used, the player with the most points wins.

In the example below, each player has had 10 turns so far. The green player has already scored 2 points, and the red player has only one point.

What are we learning in Chemical Science?



Foundation

Looking at the different materials that objects are made out of and what the properties of these materials are.

ie: The slide is made out of plastic because it needs to be smooth and able to withstand rain

Year One

Looking at everyday materials and some ways that they can be physically changed.

ie: Cooked and uncooked pasta

Year Two

Looking at different materials and what happens when you mix them with other materials.

ie: Mixing corn flour and water.
Mixing solids.

Year Three

Looking at how heating and cooling (adding and removing heat) can change the state of solids and liquids.

ie: Melting, freezing and dissolving.

Year Four

Looking at natural and processed materials, their physical properties and how these properties can influence their use.

ie: Glass is transparent, hard and not absorbent.

Year Five

Looking at solids, liquids and gases and observing their properties.

ie: Some liquids are thick and they don't flow as easily as runny liquids. Solids hold their own shape whereas liquids take the shape of their container.

Year Six

Looking at changes to materials and whether these changes are reversible or irreversible.

We also discuss whether these changes are chemical or physical changes.

ie: Rusting, melting, freezing and burning.

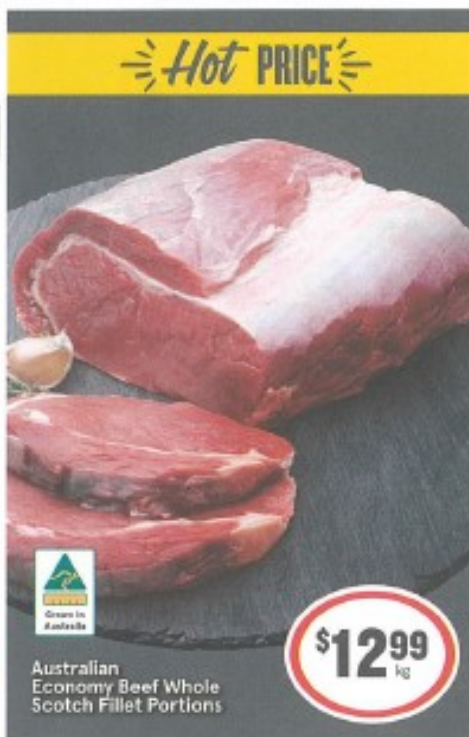
